Acute Leukemia/Cellular Therapy

Permanent Full-time

The Department of Medical Oncology and Hematology, CancerCare Manitoba (CCMB), in conjunction with Shared Health Manitoba and the Section of Hematology/Oncology, Department of Internal Medicine, Rady College of Medicine, Max Rady Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Manitoba (U of M), Winnipeg, are seeking a Clinical Hematologist who would have a main focus on Acute Leukemias as well as cellular therapy (stem cell transplantation and immune effector cell therapy).

The Department of Medical Oncology and Hematology (DMOH), CCMB, and Section of Hematology/Oncology, consists of 40 faculty members based at the two CCMB sites that are U of M-affiliated teaching hospitals in Winnipeg. The Manitoba BMT Program is a FACT-accredited comprehensive service that includes an ASHI-accredited HLA Laboratory, Cellular Therapy Laboratory and combined adult and pediatric cellular therapy services that are responsible for stem cell transplantation and cellular therapeutics for the province. There is integration of the acute leukemia service with cellular therapy. We anticipate clinical delivery of novel cellular therapies (such as CAR-T cells) in the near future.. The Adult Leukemia and Cellular Therapy group is active in translational, clinical and outcomes/registry research and is looking for a new team member to participate in provision of patient care on the inpatient and outpatient acute leukemia/Cellular Therapy service and teaching of all levels of trainees. There is opportunity for collaborative research with CCMB's Research Institute for Oncology and Hematology (RIOH).

Qualifications: This academic position includes expectation of independent/collaborative research and teaching in the programs of CCMB and the U of M, as well as excellence in patient care. Candidates must have specialty qualifications in Internal Medicine and Hematology in the country of current practice and must be eligible for registration with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba. Certification in Hematology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada is preferred. Additional training in cellular therapy is required including comfort with immune effector cell therapy and allogeneic stem cell transplantation. Income and rank will be commensurate with experience and qualifications. Competitive remuneration and excellent benefit packages are offered. CancerCare Manitoba, Shared Health Manitoba, and the Rady College of Medicine, encourage applications from qualified women and men, including visible minorities, Aboriginal peoples, and persons with disabilities. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
