## An Important New Partnership

We have heard from some of you that you would like to provide your blood samples at labs that are close to home. For the past year, we've been working hard to find a solution to this request, and are now extremely excited to announce that we have entered a partnership with Dynacare!

We can now send participants to any of five Dynacare locations across Winnipeg to have blood drawn. We plan to monitor the success of this partnership and adapt to meet your needs, and hope to offer a similar service to those of you who live outside the city in the future.

The rest of our in-person data collection will still occur at our study center. However, this partnership will help keep appointments brief and make sure we don't interfere with patients visiting the lab at CancerCare Manitoba.

## The SunFit Study: A New Project

- SunFit is a research project led by Dr. Ivan Litvinov from McGill University.
- SunFit aims to:
  - Understand the risk factors for developing cutaneous melanoma in Canada.
  - Better understand what the population knows about skin cancer, sun protection, and how they protect themselves from the sun.
- You can expect to receive an email from us inviting you to participate between July and September 2023.
- Participation in this project is completely voluntary, and will not impact your relationship with the Manitoba Tomorrow Project in any way.

We have partnered with a research team based out of McGill University to participate in the SunFit project this summer.

By participating in this project, you will help the McGill team (and by extension, the Manitoba Tomorrow Project) understand Manitobans' knowledge of their personal melanoma risk, level of concern regarding melanoma, and what protective behaviors are usually taken.

All you'll need to do is sign a consent form, and complete a 5 to 10-minute online survey.
